NOTIFICATION

Dated Aizawl, the 12th January, 2026

No. F. 12013/1/2018-DC&MA(C) : Whereas it has come to the attention of the Hon'ble Governor that illegal recruitment has continued unabated despite the imposition of the strict moratorium order and that in deviation from the intent of the Sixth Schedule to the Constitution of India, constant political instability is plaguing the Chakma Autonomous District Council.

And whereas, the Hon'ble Governor is of the opinion that the Study Group on Administration of the Autonomous District Councils headed by the Chief Secretary and earlier report submitted by Shri Cheemala Siva Gopal Reddy, IAS need to be accorded legal sanctity and Constitutional backing.

And whereas, opinion of the Council of Ministers was obtained as mandated by Para 20-BB of the Sixth Schedule, and the Council of Ministers advised the Hon'ble Governor that the Council of Ministers is not in favour of constituting another Inquiry Commission.

And whereas, despite the advice of the Council of Ministers, the Governor deems it necessary to constitute an Inquiry Commission.

Now, therefore, in exercise of his discretionary powers under paragraph 20-BB of the Sixth Schedule read with paragraph 14(1) to the Constitution of India, the Governor of Mizoram is pleased to constitute an Inquiry Commission headed by Deputy Commissioner, Lunglei.

Terms of Reference:

The Inquiry Commission shall enquire into the following issues related to the Chakma Autonomous District Council:

1. Illegal Recruitment:

On 18th January 2023, then Governor imposed strict moratorium on recruitment in the CADC pending the approval and notification of proper recruitment rules. The moratorium was imposed based on the Inquiry Commission Report of Shri Amol Srivastava IAS, constituted under Para 14 of the Sixth Schedule.

However, there have been complaints from various quarters that illegal recruitment has continued unabated even after this moratorium. The Inquiry Commission shall look into this issue.

2. Study Group Report:

The Study Group on the Administration of the ADCs, headed by the Chief Secretary, has submitted comprehensive report to Hon'ble Governor. However, it has rightly been opposed by certain political functionaries of the ADCs that the Study Group Report lacks legal sanction.

In order to accord legal sanctity and Constitutional backing, the Study Group Report shall be looked into.

3. Report by Shri Cheemala Siva Gopal Reddy IAS:

As directed by Hon'ble Governor, Shri Cheemala Siva Gopal Reddy, IAS had submitted Report on the CADC in his capacity as DC Lawngtlai & Caretaker, CADC.

This report shall also be looked into in order to accord legal sanction and Constitutional backing.

4. Political Instability:

The Inquiry Commission shall also be tasked to look into the constant political instability plaguing the CADC, and to submit concrete proposal in the best interest of the public.

The Inquiry Commission shall submit its Report within a period of six (6) months.

Detailed report alongwith recommendations should be submitted within a period of 6 (six) months.
